Welcome to Mass! Today we begin the season of Advent and a new liturgical year. The theme of the readings for the first few days of Advent aren't so much about preparing for the celebration of the coming of Christ at Christmas but preparing for that final coming - something that the Creed reminds us of each Sunday: 'He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead.'

Our new Sunday Missals have now arrived, and we are able to use them from this weekend. It is wonderful to have a dignified long-lasting book to assist us in the following the liturgy of the word each week. Let us get into the habit of using these now. That said we are aware the print size is a little small. As such, there will a few copies of a more accessible large print version of the Sunday readings available from the stewards for those who really need it.

#### Holy Communion under both kinds:

Receiving communion either in the form of the sacred host and/or from the chalice results in communion with our Lord Jesus Christ, body, blood, soul and divinity.

Whilst there is no greater communion with Jesus Christ achieved by receiving under both kinds, there is of course a greater sign value that recalls the actions of the disciples at the last supper. Namely, both eating and drinking at the wedding feast of the lamb.

From now on, at all Sunday masses in both churches there will be the option of receiving Holy Communion under both kinds. Please note that this is an entirely personal decision and there is no obligation to do so.

On your way into church today, you will have seen a diagram showing the points of distribution of Holy Communion. Please note this is a one-way system, in which everyone will pass the chalice on the way back to their seat. The stewards will be there to assist you as we adapt to these new movements.

Under certain circumstances e.g, difficulties swallowing solid food, extreme gluten intolerance, some individuals may choose to receive Holy Communion only from the chalice at Mass.

**Walsingham Pilgrimage 2025:** We are planning our annual weekend pilgrimage to 'England's Nazareth' to the shrine of Our Lady in Walsingham. The date of the pilgrimage is Friday 25<sup>th</sup> April – Sunday 27<sup>th</sup> April 2025 which is the weekend after Easter Sunday and Divine Mercy Sunday. The total cost of the weekend is £285 per person and includes transport and en-suite accommodation with breakfast, dinner, and Sunday lunch.
