Welcome to Mass on the Second Sunday of Advent! Next Sunday, there will be the Blessing of the Bambinelli. This is an old tradition whereby children (and others!) are encouraged to bring the baby Jesus from their home nativity sets to be blessed on Gaudete Sunday. This is a simple way in which we can connect our own nativity scenes at home to the celebration of Christmas in our churches. The prayer of blessing that we will use was composed by Pope Benedict, and it will say: 'We pray that, with your blessing, these images of Jesus, who is about to come among us, may be a sign of your presence and love in our homes.'

Holy Communion under both kinds:

Receiving communion either in the form of the sacred host and/or from the chalice results in communion with our Lord Jesus Christ, body, blood, soul and divinity.

Whilst there is no greater communion with Jesus Christ achieved by receiving under both kinds, there is of course a greater sign value that recalls the actions of the disciples at the last supper. Namely, both eating and drinking at the wedding feast of the lamb.

From now on, at all Sunday Masses in both churches there will be the option of receiving Holy Communion under both kinds. Please note that this is an entirely personal decision and there is no obligation to do so.

On your way into church today, you will have seen a diagram showing the points of distribution of Holy Communion. Please note this is a one-way system, in which everyone will pass the chalice on the way back to their seat. The stewards will be there to assist you as we adapt to these new movements.

Under certain circumstances e.g, difficulties swallowing solid food, extreme gluten intolerance, some individuals may choose to receive Holy Communion only from the chalice at Mass.

Please note that you are not able to intinct (dip) the Sacred Host into the Precious Blood but these must be received and consumed separately.

Walsingham Pilgrimage 2025: We are planning our annual weekend pilgrimage to 'England's Nazareth' to the shrine of Our Lady in Walsingham.
