Parish Job Vacancy: Now sometime after the arrival of our new parish priests, we have reviewed exactly what support would best assist our priests in helping them to be more available for their ministry. It has become apparent that we are in need of more support than that of cleaning and ironing, and that we indeed have a need for someone to assist us further in the Parish Office, in the Sacristy, and in various pastoral situations also. This new role therefore pools the existing jobs of cleaner and relief-housekeeper, modifying these alongside responsibilities that of others. We therefore seek the support of a dedicated practising Catholic who is flexible to our current and evolving needs as a Parish. Parish Assistant

(Permanent Contract – 24 hours Per Week – £,12 Per Hour)

Job Role:

- To clean the Parish Office, Conference Room, and Presbytery.
- To assist the resident priests with their ironing, making beds, and with our hospitality to guests.
- To set-up for Parish Masses, and otherwise manage the Sacristy (including ordering of the necessary supplies).
- To assist in the Parish Office when required, particularly offering relief when other staff or volunteers are unavailable. This will include answering the phone/message taking, the preparation of the Sunday Bulletin, and other secretarial duties.
- To assist the priests in pastoral situations when deemed appropriate.

Working Hours:

- We are looking for someone who can commit to a routine of regular working hours, whilst leaving some flexibility for when other tasks may be completed. Whilst this is to be confirmed with the candidate, we envisage:
 - Monday Friday 9am 12noon (15hrs)
 - 1hr each evening there is an evening Mass (5hrs)
 - Flexible working time (2 x 2hrs in an afternoon or evening)
- We are looking for someone who is flexible, and who may on occasion work a few extra hours (e.g., during a staff holiday), later taking off those hours in lieu.

Person Specification:

Essential:

- Is entitled to work in the UK.
- Given the need for this person to assist in pastoral situations, willing to undertake the Diocesan Safer Recruitment Process, including a DBS and two references indicating suitability of character.
- Is a Practising Catholic, those currently outside of the Parish needing a reference from their Parish Priest attesting to that fact.
- Is able to commit to the work-schedule outlined above (or similar).

Desirable:

- Has a driving license (provides greater flexibility for assisting pastorally).
- Has some appropriate experience (e.g., cleaning, pastoral, secretarial etc.).
- Has existing knowledge of the Parish.

Applications & Interviews:

- Those interested in applying for this role should contact Dawn Feeney, our Parish Office Manager, in the first instance.
- We will be accepting applications up to 12 noon on Friday 21st June 2024.
- Interviews will be arranged with shortlisted applicants during the week beginning the 24th June.
- We hope to appoint someone in this role to begin work on Monday 1st July.

READINGS FOR SUNDAY MASS

FIRST READING

Genesis 3:9-15

The Lord God called to the man after he had eaten of the tree. 'Where are you?' he asked. 'I heard the sound of you in the garden;' he replied 'I was afraid because I was naked, so I hid.' 'Who told you that you were naked?' he asked 'Have you been eating of the tree I forbade you to eat?' The man replied, 'It was the woman you put with me; she gave me the fruit, and I ate it.' Then the Lord God asked the woman, 'What is this you have done?' The woman replied, 'The serpent tempted me and I ate.' Then the Lord God said to the serpent, 'Because you have done this, 'Be accursed beyond all cattle, all wild beasts. You shall crawl on your belly and eat dust every day of your life. I will make you enemies of each other: you and the woman, your offspring and her offspring. It will crush your head and you will strike its heel.'

SECOND READING

2 Corinthians 4:13-5:1

As we have the same spirit of faith that is mentioned in scripture – *I believed, and therefore I spoke* – we too believe and therefore we too speak, knowing that he who raised the Lord Jesus to life will raise us with Jesus in our turn, and put us by his side and you with us. You see, all this is for your benefit, so that the more grace is multiplied among people, the more thanksgiving there will be, to the glory of God.

That is why there is no weakening on our part, and instead, though this outer man of ours may be falling into decay, the inner man is renewed day by day. Yes, the troubles which are soon over, though they weigh little, train us for the carrying of a weight of eternal glory which

is out of all proportion to them. And so we have no eyes for things that are visible, but only for things that are invisible; for visible things last only for a time, and the invisible things are eternal.

For we know that when the tent that we live in on earth is folded up, there is a house built by God for us, an everlasting home not made by human hands, in the heavens.

GOSPEL READING

Mark 3:20-35

Jesus went home with his disciples, and such a crowd collected that they could not even have a meal. When his relatives heard of this, they set out to take charge of him, convinced he was out of his mind.

The scribes who had come down from Jerusalem were saying, 'Beelzebul is in him' and, 'It is through the prince of devils that he casts devils out.' So he called them to him and spoke to them in parables, 'How can Satan cast out Satan? If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot last. And if a household is divided against itself, that household can never stand. Now if Satan has rebelled against himself and is divided, he cannot stand either – it is the end of him. But no one can make his way into a strong man's house and burgle his property unless he has tied up the strong man first. Only then can he burgle his house.

'I tell you solemnly, all men's sins will be forgiven, and all their blasphemies; but let anyone blaspheme against the Holy Spirit and he will never have forgiveness: he is guilty of an eternal sin.' This was because they were saying, 'An unclean spirit is in him.'

His mother and brothers now arrived and, standing outside, sent in a message asking for him. A crowd was sitting round him at the time the message was passed to him, 'Your mother and brothers and sisters are outside asking for you.' He replied, 'Who are my mother and my brothers?' And looking round at those sitting in a circle about him, he said, 'Here are my mother and my brothers. Anyone who does the will of God, that person is my brother and sister and mother.'
